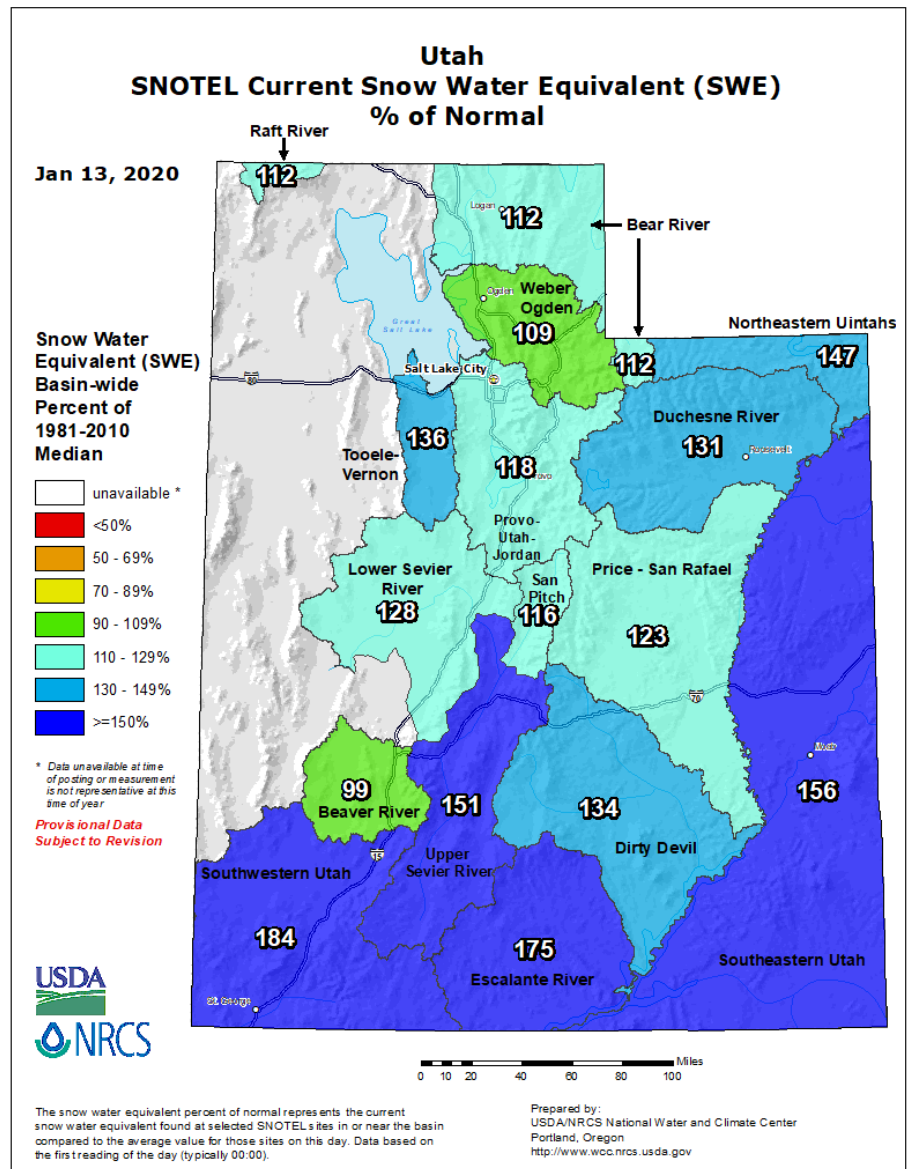

Please Return Your Ballot

In early February all stockholders will receive a ballot in the mail to vote for positions on our Board of Directors.

Please vote! Our Board of Directors makes decisions that determine the future of **your** water company. We must receive votes from a percentage of our stockholders in order to continue doing business.

Please respond in one of three ways:

1. PREFERRED–Vote at the annual meeting at Draper City Hall, 1020 East Pioneer Road, 7 p.m. Weds. March 18.
2. Return your marked ballot in person or via fax, mail or email (hope@waterpro.net) before March 18.
3. If you don't want to vote for any of those on the ballot, please mark the NONE box and return the ballot even if you choose not to vote for anyone. This will allow your shares of stock to be represented and give the company the 20% needed to constitute a quorum.

It's a great way to help others reap the rewards of gardening while you put some extra space to good use.
