As winter draws toward an end, how does the snowpack look for Utah – and why is it so important?

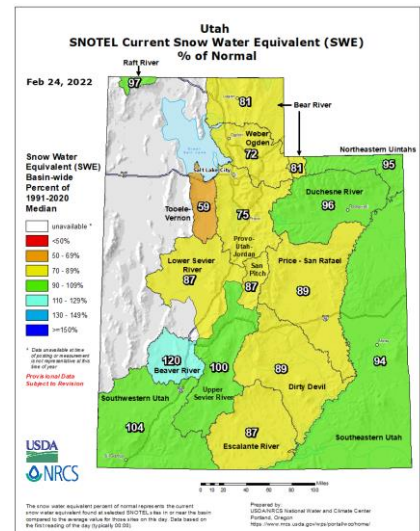
In Utah, approximately 95% of our water supply comes from the snow that falls in the mountains during the winter. But as this chart shows, the snowpack is currently below normal in much of the state. Combined with our severe multi-year drought, the picture for the water supply doesn't look good.

What could change the state's water outlook?

- 1. More snow.** The snowpack typically doesn't peak until approximately 45 days after this information was gathered, so there is still a possibility that higher-than-average snowfall in the late part of the winter could help create a better snowpack.
- 2. A cool spring.** The weather in the spring affects the runoff and the water supply. A cool, wet spring

makes for a longer runoff – and more available water – than a hot, dry spring.

- 3. Conservation.** This the only factor that we can control! If all Utah residents get serious about conserving water, we can protect our state's dwindling water supply while still preserving our beautiful state and way of life. To get started, click the Conservation link on our website.



Get Ready for Irrigation Season!

Pressure irrigation (PI) season officially begins on April 15, but we begin pressuring up the system as early as April 1. So make sure your stop and waste is turned off to avoid flooding when water enters the system. Check your irrigation system and repair broken sprinkler heads or damaged lines *before* the pressurized water causes problems in your yard or your neighborhood!



Construction to Begin on 1300 E

This month we will begin construction to replace the water line under the street on 1300 East from 13400 to 13800 South. We anticipate this project will take about four to six weeks.

We will be coordinating with Draper City, which is widening the road at the same time. By scheduling both projects together, we can avoid tearing up the street twice and minimize the disruption to residents. We appreciate Draper City's cooperation in planning and executing this project.



Remember to Return Your Ballot

All Draper Irrigation Company shareholders should have received a ballot in the mail during February allowing them to vote for members of our Board of Directors and to vote in our referendum about discontinuing the addition of fluoride to our drinking water.

Please do one of the following:

- Fill out your ballot and bring it to our shareholders' meeting on Wednesday, March 16.
- If you do not plan to attend the meeting, fill out and sign your ballot and return it to our office before March 16.

Please return your ballot even if you choose not to vote. This will allow your shares of stock to be represented and give the company the percentage of votes needed to constitute a quorum.
